INTERGENERATIONAL CREATIVE FUSION WORKSHOPS

Lithuania: Storytelling and Digital Art

On January 14, an intergenerational workshop titled Storytelling and Art took place in Lithuania, hosted by VsI Ziniu Kodas. The event welcomed 32 participants, including 29 women and 3 educators, who explored visual storytelling through graphic design and photography. Digital tools like Canva, Remini, ChatGPT, and CapCut were introduced, allowing participants to create compelling visual narratives. Many attendees had their first experience using AI tools, providing valuable insights into digital innovation.



















INTERGENERATIONAL CREATIVE FUSION WORKSHOPS

Italy: Artistic Collaboration and Digital Creativity

From October to November 2024, FUTOUR facilitated Generational Creative Fusion workshops in Italy under the guidance of Ana Maria Solís and Domingo Ferrandis. These workshops promoted collaboration between women of different generations, using art, storytelling, and digital tools to bridge generational gaps and preserve cultural heritage. Participants explored tools like Canva, Miro, Napkin, and Storybird to create narratives that addressed cultural and generational barriers. The workshops culminated in three conceptual projects focused on intergenerational inclusion and storytelling, showcasing how art and technology can unite diverse perspectives.









INTERGENERATIONAL CREATIVE FUSION WORKSHOPS

Romania: Exploring Intergenerational Narratives through Art

On October 4-5, Fundatia Professional (ProF) conducted an intergenerational storytelling workshop in Romania. The workshop brought together 10 women aged 50+ and 6 young women over 19, fostering a meaningful exchange of experiences. Guided by artistic facilitator Renata Veer, participants explored the power of storytelling through structured interviews, role rotations, and collaborative art creation.

The primary outcome was a collection of visually compelling stories, reinforcing the importance of preserving personal and collective histories through digital and artistic mediums.













VIRTUAL ART EXPO: A COLLABORATIVE DIGITAL GALLERY

One of the major outcomes of the project is the creation of a Multilingual Virtual Art Expo, showcasing the work produced by participants from Italy, Lithuania, and Romania. Three distinct galleries have been established, each highlighting local perspectives while contributing to a broader European cultural dialogue.
