CROSS-CULTURAL CREATIVE WORKSHOP

The Cross-Cultural Creative Workshop is a core element of the ArtTech project, aiming to foster intercultural understanding and artistic collaboration. Held in Italy, Lithuania, and Romania, these workshops have brought together young women from diverse backgrounds to explore their cultural narratives through innovative methods. Participants have used tools like AI-powered digital art platforms, photography, and storytelling techniques to craft unique projects that reflect their identities and shared experiences.

In Italy, participants combined photography with design to explore themes of empathy and cultural diversity.

Lithuania focused on the intersection of traditional and digital art, guided by local artists who helped participants develop their creative expressions.

Romania's workshops introduced young women to tools such as ArtFlow and Canva, enabling them to create artwork that bridges cultural gaps and highlights gender-sensitive themes. These workshops are a testament to the power of collaboration and creativity in building mutual understanding and inclusivity.









Intergenerational Creative Fusion Workshops

The Generational Creative Fusion workshops continued to make an impact in Italy, Lithuania, and Romania, fostering intercultural and intergenerational connections through art and storytelling.

- In Italy, from October 14 to November 8, 2024, workshops in Modena explored artistic techniques blending traditional and digital methods. Participants collaborated on artworks that strengthened intergenerational bonds and celebrated creativity.
- In Lithuania, a free workshop is scheduled for January 14, 2025, at the Hotel Panorama in Vilnius. Guided by experienced educators and participants will learn to craft compelling stories through various art forms. Open to all ages, the session will conclude with certificates for attendees. Register soon, as spots are limited!
- In Romania, Fundatia Professional organized the workshop in October, bringing together psychologists, university professors, artists, high school teachers, and engineers. These participants shared their life stories with six young women as part of the Generational Creative Fusion initiative. The event also featured the use of a text-to-image AI generator, DALL-E2, to create visual interpretations of text descriptions. This effort highlights Fundatia Professional's contributions to the ArtTech project, particularly in driving its impact and dissemination













Upcoming Virtual ArtExpo and Dialogue

The Virtual ArtExpo and Dialogue aims to showcase the artistic creations of project participants while fostering meaningful discussions on generational and cross-cultural storytelling. Launching in February 2025, the Virtual ArtExpo will present artworks from all partners and participants on an interactive platform. This platform will allow attendees to explore visual stories, leave feedback, and engage with the content.

The Live Dialogue Session, scheduled for February 20, 2025, will include reflections from participants, panel discussions, and breakout sessions.

These dialogues will focus on generational fusion, cross-cultural creativity, and digital storytelling. FUTOUR will coordinate the event and manage technical aspects, while all partners will contribute artistic works and promote the event within their communities.
