About the ArtTech Project

The ArtTech Project is a collaborative initiative involving partners from Italy, Romania, and Lithuania, aimed at empowering young women aged 19 to 29 through the intersection of technology, art, and cultural exploration. This project provides an innovative space where participants can develop digital competencies, enhance their artistic skills, and engage in intercultural dialogue.

ArtTech specifically focuses on bridging gender-based inequalities in the youth sector, recognizing that young women—particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds—often face barriers in education, employment, and civic participation. By integrating digital technology with artistic creation, the project promotes inclusivity, self-expression, and personal growth.

Through interactive workshops and international collaborations, participants enhance their digital literacy and creative skills, increasing their employability and adaptability in a technology-driven world. Additionally, the project fosters a strong international network, connecting young women with peers and mentors from diverse backgrounds to celebrate their achievements and narratives through digital art.

The outcomes of ArtTech include a Virtual "ArtTech Expo", where cross-cultural collaborations and digital artworks are showcased, and an empowered community of young women who gain confidence, develop valuable skill sets, and share meaningful experiences. These results contribute to breaking gender barriers in technology and fostering a more inclusive and creative society.

Challenges Faced by Young Women in Digital Arts in Italy, Lithuania, and Romania

Young women in Italy, Lithuania, and Romania face significant challenges in the field of digital arts, often shaped by gender disparities, societal stereotypes, and economic constraints. These barriers impact their access to education, professional opportunities, and the ability to sustain a career in digital arts.

In Italy, gender stereotypes continue to influence young women's participation in ICT and STEM-related careers, including digital arts. The performing and creative industries are particularly affected by unequal power dynamics, where both gender and age discrimination can limit career advancement.

Additionally, young female artists often face precarious working conditions, as career success is increasingly tied to social media visibility rather than traditional opportunities. Women who engage in digital activism and content creation also encounter emotional challenges, as they must constantly navigate online harassment and the pressure to maintain audience engagement.

In **Lithuania**, deeply ingrained **gender stereotypes** continue to shape the digital and creative industries, often discouraging women from pursuing careers in these fields. **Gender equality policies remain fragmented**, and the lack of long-term state involvement in preventing gender-based violence further exacerbates the issue.

Additionally, Lithuanian women continue to the majority of household bear responsibilities, making it difficult dedicate time to professional and artistic development. The gender pay gap is another major obstacle, as women earn significantly less than men, particularly when they take career breaks for childcare. This financial disparity increases the risk of economic instability and limits their ability to sustain a career in digital arts.





In Romania, financial constraints pose a major challenge for young women pursuing digital arts, as it is often not a financially sustainable career choice. Many artists struggle to balance creative work with other career paths or educational commitments, which can slow their artistic progress and limit access to professional opportunities.

Although the internet has helped challenge traditional stereotypes, societal biases regarding gender and age remain, discouraging many young women from fully embracing a career in digital arts.

Despite these obstacles, digital art remains a powerful tool for self-expression and empowerment. Addressing these challenges requires stronger gender policies, financial support for young female artists, and greater recognition of digital arts as a viable career path.

The **ArtTech project** aims to **create a supportive environment** where young women can develop their skills, gain visibility, and overcome barriers in the digital arts sector.
